- •To introduce the format of IELTS Writing Part I (Academic), and to practice using appropriate language to express information shown in bar charts and tables
- 3. THE TYPES OF TASKS IN PART I (ACADEMIC)

Primary objective:

- •To explore the different types of visual information presented in Part I (Academic), and to practice reporting this information in written English
- Vocabulary describing change is introduced
- 4. THE MAIN FEATURES IN PART I (ACADEMIC)

Primary objective:

•To introduce the concept of main features in the context of IELTS Part I (Academic), and to gain practice in identifying these and describing them in written English.

- •To practice writing descriptions of maps and processes, and making comparisons between two graphics.

- To understand the overall structure of IELTS Writing Part I (Academic), and to apply the skills and knowledge from previous lessons so that the student can complete the entire task and achieve the required word count
